Community leaders will gather at the University of Toronto Mississauga campus on Tuesday to discuss big ideas to improve our city.

They'll be taking part in the Mississauga Summit, an event running from 4:30-9:30 p.m. at UTM. Discussion will focus on how to turn those big ideas into reality.

Guest speakers will include Calgary Mayor Naheed Nenshi and University of Toronto Professor David Wolfe.

Nenshi, the lead author of *Building Up: Making Canada's Cities Magnets for Talent and Engines of Development*, will provide insight into how Mississauga can continue to be a leader in the province.

Wolfe, who has been an advisor to the the Royal Commission on the Economic Union and Development Prospects for Canada, will offer his perspective on development and growth in Mississauga.

Between 2009-10, community members met regularly to brainstorm. The plan was to come up with big ideas to address five key issues facing our city: building Mississauga's human services infrastructure, creating a post-secondary education strategy, waterfront development and environmental sustainability, cultivating Mississauga as a Centre of Excellence for diversity and immigration and creating quality jobs.

Summit co-chairs Shelley White, President and CEO of the United Way of Peel Region, and Brian Crombie of Crombie Capital Partners, will lead the discussion of ideas.
